

COLLEGE CAMPUS VISITS...

Yes, it is still summer, but also a great time to start thinking about college visit planning. Most colleges now offer virtual campus visits available on the school website. These videos allow students to "visit" several schools as they narrow down their list. Once the student has narrowed down their list- scheduling a in person visit is just as easy.

Some things to remember:

- Schedule as early as possible, dates fill up fast. Also if you need a particular date that is full- call the Admission's office and ask; they will try to accommodate if they can.
- There will be lots of walking- wear gym shoes and dress for the weather.
 Bringing a water bottle is a good idea.
- Plan for 2-4 hours on average for a in person visit. If possible, eat on campus. The food matters.
- Have questions to ask- create a list in advance. Remember there are no "dumb" questions.
- If you want to visit an academic department, you will need to ask in advance. While most departments love to hear from potential students- they are not well staffed for unplanned visits, especially in the summer.
- Colleges create themed visit days based on high school status, gender, program, etc. These are a great opportunity to meet students who will have things in common with the student.
- As a mentor, if you would like to take a student on a visit- make sure to have the parent sign a transportation release form.
