Students can use YouScience data, Sinclair resources to find career paths

Have you ever thought about your future self and wondered about how to best find your career "sweet spot" where your interests, values, and skills align? Finding your career sweet spot can lead to great job satisfaction, fulfillment, and success.

Bringing awareness of your aptitudes and interests as you begin your career path is essential. YouScience is an assessment created with a series of brain games that show your natural-born skills, and when combined with your career interests will be a tool used to create career pathways.

We are all unique and our aptitudes explain how our brain is wired. It highlights each student's skills and assets and how these can be applied to the best careers for the student. Once the students see this personalized and meaningful data, it flips the switch on which courses to take or job shadowing opportunities they should take advantage of moving forward.

Using data to drive career decisions

Using the YouScience data, we are also able to identify the top aptitudes and interests of our high school students in select careers in the Dayton area. Using the data from July to December of 2023, our students currently have the highest aptitudes in advanced manufacturing, agriculture & natural resources and health science. On the flip side, our students have top interests in arts & media, human services and teaching.

The challenge now is to

use this data to provide opportunities for our students through job shadowing, apprenticeships, career development coursework and adjust our existing curricular offerings to reflect the students' needs.

For students and families across the region, the array of options can be overwhelming and leave one feeling unsure of which opportunity would be best for their future self. The truth is that there is not a one-size-fitsall approach to finding your path. However, knowing what is available empowers students to take the next step that is best aligned to their aptitudes and interests.

Sinclair programs leveraging cost savings

Sinclair College provides

students opportunities to take their next step in many areas. Students may take College Credit Plus courses and/or earn certificates (there are over 200 available!) that can empower them to begin working in their field while continuing towards a more advanced degree.

Students who earn 24 college credits (CCP or Advanced Placement) while in high school and maintain a 2.5 GPA, may be eligible for the Free to Finish Scholarship where they are able to complete an associates degree at Sinclair for free.

For those who obtain certification in their desired field, they can often obtain employment where career advancement opportunities and incentives exist. The state is currently providing scholarships for a variety of certificate programs. Sinclair also partners

with healthcare providers, for example the Premier Academy offers individuals opportunities to receive free schooling in high-demand roles to advance their career within the Premier Health system. Sinclair also offers apprenticeship programs for skilled trades.


Powerful partnerships

Additionally, Sinclair has numerous transfer agreements with various universities across the state, which provide assurance that the classes taken at Sinclair will transfer to another university. The UD/Sinclair Academy and Wright Path program are just two examples of these formalized partnerships which provide guidance, support, and tremendous cost savings to students.

Sinclair has university transfer advising/support available to help students plan and successfully transfer. Students can also use the Ohio Transfer 36 in order to see which classes will transfer to all public universities in the state of Ohio. For specific guidance, it is advised that students meet with a Sinclair advisor to map out a plan that aligns to their needs and goals.


