


Mentor Roundtable and learn some helpful tips and nuggets to assist you in your mentoring role.

- All-Class Mentors: Please remember to check the school calendar to ensure that you're not meeting on Presidents' Day in February or other days when school is not in session.
- All-Class Mentors: With Spring around the corner, we plan to host the pizza parties again with mentees and mentors as a group during the lunch period at the schools. Additional details will be forthcoming soon.
- All-Class Mentors: It's mentor recruitment time! We will be selecting our new, 15th Cohort
 MCOCP Scholars by the end of February 2025. If you know of someone who may be interested in
 serving as a mentor for this incoming group of mentees, please let Patrick know. We recognize
 that we can't start too early in the mentor recruitment process.
- All-Class Mentors: Miami University is hosting its annual Day of Champions on Saturday, 2/22/25. This daylong event includes breakfast and lunch, an information session, tour, and basketball game against Kent State. Interested MCOCP Scholars should <u>register</u> online.
- All-Class Mentors: MCOCP is proud to announce that we have two new college partners, Otterbein University and Bowling Green State University (BGSU). Otterbein was added this year and is an option for the Class of 2025. BGSU will be available as a college choice beginning with the Class of 2026.
- Sophomore Mentors: Recently, sophomores across Montgomery County had the opportunity to visit the Miami Valley Career Technology Center (MVCTC) and explore the school and its programs as an option for them during their junior and senior high school years. Please note that MCOCP students can apply and attend MVCTC (or their school's equivalent), if admitted. At present, we have several program participants enrolled at MVCTC; matriculation there does not jeopardize their participation in MCOCP. As long as they meet our partner colleges' admission requirements, they remain eligible for the scholarship. The only change would be how your weekly meetings would be conducted -- whether you'd meet on site or elsewhere.
- Junior Mentors: MCOCP Scholars, their families, and mentors should have received an invitation in the mail to The College Promise Scholar Night. It will be held on Thursday, 2/27/25 from 5:30 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. at Sinclair Community College's New Student Enrollment Center (Building 10). All mentees are expected to attend so that they can meet and interact with our college partners.
- Senior Mentors: By now, senior MCOCP participants should have completed and submitted all of their college admissions applications. From this point forward, they should be checking their emails and college portals on a regular basis for updates and provide any requested remaining documentation.
- Senior Mentors: The Dayton Foundation's <u>ScholarshipCONNECT</u> application opened on 1/8/25. It is a database to over 300 local scholarships through the foundation. Please encourage your mentee to apply and take advantage of this wonderful opportunity. <u>The last day to apply is 3/7/25 by 4 p.m.</u> Note that information from the FAFSA will be needed for the application.

About Charity Adams Earley




- BLACK A graduate of Wilberforce University, Adams Earley was an educator, community activist, and officer in the U.S. military.
- · Adams Earley served during World War II (enlisted in what later became known as the Women's Army Corps) and earned the rank of Lieutenant Colonel, the first and highest African-American female officer at that time.
- Her military story is told in Tyler Perry's recent film, The Six Triple Eight, available on Netflix.
- · Dayton Public Schools has named a school, Charity Adams Earley Girls Academy, in her honor.
- She resided in Dayton several decades until her death in 2002.
- There is the Dr. Stanley A. Earley, Jr., and Charity Edna Earley Fund at The Dayton Foundation.




