

- Sophomore, Junior and Senior Mentors: "Science and Technology of Sports," a summer camp sponsored by Sinclair Community College's Women in STEM (WiSTEM), will take place Monday, 6/9/25 Friday, 6/13/25. The camp is open to rising sophomores, juniors and seniors. **Registration** is now open. The \$10 fee covers registration, daily lunch and a T-shirt.
- Sophomore Mentors: YMCA of Greater Dayton, in partnership with Wright State University, is hosting Junior Leadership Dayton for **rising juniors**. This leadership development program meets one day each month from August through April. Participants will be exposed to various social and economic issues in the Miami Valley. 
March Fun Facts and Dates to Remember


