


Discussion Topics

University of Findlay will be joining Bowling Green State University (BGSU), and Ohio Wesleyan University as options beginning with the Class of 2026. Otterbein University was added this school year.

- Freshman, Sophomore and Junior Mentors: "Science and Technology of Sports," a summer camp sponsored by Sinclair Community College's Women in STEM (WiSTEM), will take place Monday, 6/9/25 Friday, 6/13/25. The camp is open to *rising* sophomores, juniors and seniors. <u>Registration</u> is now open. The \$10 fee covers registration, daily lunch and a T-shirt.
- Sophomore and Junior Mentors: The <u>application</u> for Miami University's Summer Scholars Program, a selective program providing a glimpse of the college experience, is now open for "high-achieving," *rising* high school juniors and seniors. The application deadline is 5/1/25. Interested MCOCP Scholars can contact Jenni for registration and financial assistance.
- Sophomore and Junior Mentors: The University of Dayton's Female Aspiring Business Scholars (FABS) is hosting an overnight summer camp from Sunday, 6/22/25 Wednesday, 6/25/25 for *rising* high school juniors and seniors interested in business. **Registration** ends on 5/10/25 and is \$300. - Sophomore and Junior Mentors: <u>Come and SEE-UD Summer Engineering Experiences</u> day-long summer camps will be held for Class of 2026 and Class of 2027 students on 6/16/25, 6/17/25 and 6/18/25. - Junior and Senior Mentors: <u>Wright State University's Horizons in Medicine Summer Program</u> is accepting applications for juniors and seniors who have successfully completed chemistry. See the above link for more details.
- Sophomore Mentors: YMCA of Greater Dayton, in partnership with Wright State University, is hosting Junior Leadership Dayton for rising juniors. This leadership development program meets one day each month from August through April. Participants will be exposed to various social and economic issues in the Miami Valley. A letter, brochure and flyer were mailed out to all current sophomore mentors and mentees in March. Current, interested sophomores can apply at this <u>link</u>.
- Junior Mentors: Your mentees should start researching and exploring colleges of interest to them. Spring and summer months are perfect times for college visits.
- Senior Mentors: Seniors and their families should have received a Decision Day Form in the U.S. mail from us. They will need to return the form to us by or before 5/30/25.
- Senior Mentors: Senior MCOCP participants should be checking their emails and college portals on a regular basis for updates and provide any requested remaining documentation. Additionally, students should be working closely with institutions where they have applied, meeting deadlines at those colleges, and communicating their decision if they have made their selection. Decision Day at most colleges is 5/1 annually.




