Happy Holidays, Joyeuses Fêtes, Felices Fiestas, Frohe Feiertage and Buone Feste to you and your families! See you in 2026!




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## Montgomery County Ohio College Promise

- Recently celebrated 15<sup>th</sup> anniversary
- Have supported 770 students
- 65% of students graduated 4-6 years removed from high school (compared to 19% of students with financial need in the county)
  - 55% with a bachelor's degree
  - 9% with an associate degree only

- **All-Class Mentors:** During the upcoming holiday breaks and semester exams, you're not expected to meet with your mentees. In addition, remember that per the *MCOCP Volunteer Mentor Handbook* (page 6), small gifts to acknowledge student achievements or for the holiday are permissible, but not expected.
- **All-Class Mentors:** For most schools, the end of the semester and second quarter will be before the holiday break or shortly after school resumes. Please strongly encourage your mentees to study early for their exams.

Our following is growing, but we'd love to get additional exposure in your networks! With any luck, more visibility may also help with mentor recruitment and connect us with potential donors.
- **All-Class Mentors:** Please remind your mentees that if they hope to be inducted into the National Honor Society during high school, they must remain active in various school, community, or faith-based groups or organizations in order to be eligible. Additionally, participation in these extracurricular activities will help to build their activities resume when they are applying to college or other opportunities.
- **All-Class Mentors:** *The MCOCP Annual Campaign: Helping Students Thrive* is underway and will end on 12/31/25. - **All-Class Mentors:** GEM (Goal Everyone Matters) Project Dayton is sponsoring its 2025-26 [GEM Student Art Contest for Suicide Prevention](#). Students in grades 6-12 can participate. If your mentee is an artist, encourage him or her to submit an original piece around this year's theme of resiliency and the importance of well-being. The contest runs until 1/12/26. - **All-Class Mentors:** It's mentor recruitment time! We will be selecting our 16th Cohort MCOCP Scholars at the end of February 2026. If you know of someone who may be interested in serving as a mentor for this incoming group of mentees, please let Patrick know. We can't start too early in the mentor recruitment process.
- **Sophomore Mentors:** Recently, sophomores across Montgomery County had the opportunity to visit the Miami Valley Career Technology Center (MVCTC) and explore the school and its programs as an option for them during their junior and senior high school years. **Please note that MCOCP students can apply and attend MVCTC (or their school's equivalent), if admitted. At present, we have several program participants enrolled at MVCTC; matriculation there does not jeopardize their participation in MCOCP. As long as they meet our partner colleges' admission requirements, they remain eligible for the scholarship.** The only change would be how your weekly meetings would be conducted -- whether you'd meet on site or elsewhere.
- **Junior Mentors:** Save the date for MCOCP's annual College Promise Scholar Night event at Wright State University! It will be held on 2/26/26 from 5:30-7:00 p.m. More information will be forthcoming for mentees, their families and mentors.
- **Senior Mentors:** By now, all seniors should have completed the FAFSA and college applications. As acceptance letters roll in, MCOCP scholars should let Jenni know where they have been admitted. **For Bowling Green State University acceptances, students should contact Jenni as soon as possible.** Further, they should be checking their emails and college portals regularly for updates and provide any requested remaining documentation.
- **Senior Mentors:** The Dayton Foundation's [ScholarshipCONNECT](#) opens on 12/17/25 for the 2026-27 academic year. The deadline for application submission is 3/6/26.



## December Fun Facts and Dates to Remember



- Bacon Day, 12/30/25






## MCOP Milestones
