






MAY DISCUSSION TOPICS

- All-Class Mentors: If your mentee is looking for summer employment, encourage them to
 complete a SOCHE (Strategic Ohio Council for Higher Education) high school internship
 application at https://www.soche.org/apply/. These internships are paid and can extend into the
 school year as well. As students enroll in college, SOCHE has internships for undergraduate and
 graduate students as well. High schoolers must be at least 15 years old to apply.
- All-Class Mentors: We have selected 55 mentees for our 14th cohort! If you know anyone who may
 be interested in becoming a mentor, please connect them with Patrick. Also, if you have a
 graduating senior and would like to extend your time as a mentor, let Patrick know. We would love
 to keep you on board!
- All-Class Mentors: The City of Dayton and University of Dayton School of Law will host a Legal Immersion Program from 6/3/24 - 6/14/24 for local high school students. This free program exposes students to the legal system and concepts, legal profession, and law school through workshops and interactive sessions. - All-Class Mentors: Did you know that there is an MCOCP Enrichment Grant available to MCOCP
 Scholars? It can go towards summer camps or other related academic pursuits. If your mentee is in
 need of assistance for something of this nature, please reach out to Patrick and/or Jenni to inquire
 if the grant is applicable. Please note that it is a one-time grant and is a maximum of \$500.
- All -Class Mentors: In addition to the MCOCP Enrichment Grant, MCOCP offers another one-time \$500 grant to program participants who are inducted into the National Honor Society or its equivalent. The award must go towards something related to the four pillars of the National Honor Society -- Scholarship, Service, Leadership and Character. Contact Patrick and/or Jenni if your mentee has an interest in taking advantage of this opportunity.
- Junior (Rising Senior) Mentors: Your mentees should start researching and exploring colleges of interest to them. Spring and summer months are perfect times for college visits.
- Senior (Current) Mentors: Students should be working closely with institutions where they have applied, meeting deadlines at those colleges, and communicating their decision if they have made their selection.
- Senior (Current) Mentors: Seniors and their families should have received a Decision Day Form in the U.S. mail from us. If not, please let us know and we'll send one again. They will need to return the form by or before 6/1/24.



May Fun Facts and Dates to Remember




