May Fun Facts and Dates to Remember

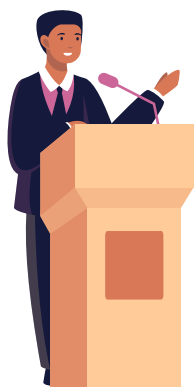

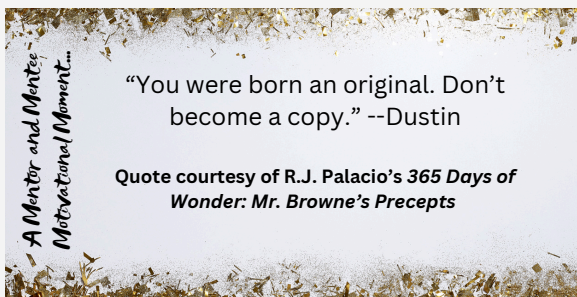
