



Students AND their guardian/parent should request their individual FSA IDs <u>now</u> so that they will have it on hand prior to completing the FAFSA. - Senior Mentors: Any seniors interested in attending Miami University MUST attend the Fall Bridges overnight event at the university. It is mandatory. Jenni will share more details with the senior MCOCP scholars, but the application deadline is due 9/26/25. NOW is the time for them to start completing the application. Questions? 


